Organizational Overview

Local Education and Economic Development Organization (LEEDO) is a not-for-profit, voluntary development organization founded in 2000 and fully functioning since 2010. Led by social and human rights activists, LEEDO works to improve the lives of vulnerable street children in Bangladesh.

LEEDO is registered with the NGO Affairs Bureau (Reg. No. 1466) and the Ministry of Women and Children Affairs (Reg. No. 413). The organization is governed by 7 executive members.

Our Vision

Through raising awareness about the dire conditions of extremely vulnerable street connected children and youth, all members of society will take responsibility to ensure their protection, enabling these children to achieve a brighter future.

Our Mission

- To educate and empower street-connected children to drive lasting social change.
- To integrate at-risk youth into the mainstream through holistic health, education, and rehabilitation.
- To restore protection and nobility to vulnerable children, ensuring they return to society with equal rights.

Our Approach

LEEDO follows a unique 4R model: **Rescue from the street** → **Reintegration with families** → **Referral to shelters** → **Rebuild Lives**.

Through this approach, Through its 4R Model: Rescue, Reintegration, Referral, and Rebuild. LEEDO supports children living on the streets to move toward safe, stable, and dignified lives.

With two Transitional Shelters, seven Schools Under the Sky, and a Mobile School, LEEDO brings protection, education, and care directly to those most in need. When family reunification is not possible, children are supported through Peace Home and trusted partners. Today, 68 children, including 26 with special needs, are growing up in a safe and caring environment, receiving education, healthcare, and psychosocial support. LEEDO ensures that every child has the chance to heal, grow, and build a better future.

This month, LEEDO's outreach team successfully rescued 26 vulnerable children from the streets and unsafe environments. Among them, 24 children were safely reintegrated with their families after proper verification, while 14 children were referred for long-term rehabilitation and care at partner shelters. These efforts reflect LEEDO's continued commitment to ensuring safety, nobility, and a brighter future for every child.

New Horizons for a Safer Childhood

In May 2026, our Founder and Executive Director Forhad Hossain embarked on a vital journey across New Zealand and Australia to strengthen our global network of care. This was much more than a standard professional tour; it was a mission driven by a deep commitment to find better and stronger ways to shield vulnerable children and youth from the shadows of abuse, exploitation and substance addiction. By connecting with international frontline workers and organizations who share this exact same heartbeat, Forhad opened doors to shared wisdom and global best practices that will directly reshape how we protect our young people right here at home.

A truly defining milestone of this trip was a collaborative meeting at RMIT University with Professor Robyn Martin, the Associate Dean of Social Work and Human Services and her dedicated team. This gathering bridged the gap between cutting-edge academic research and practical, on-the-ground care, blending decades of social work expertise with our lived experiences in the field. Sitting together in a spirit of shared empathy, they explored innovative ways to support young survivors who have faced unimaginable trauma, ensuring that our therapeutic approaches are backed by the world's best care models.

Bringing these global insights back with us marks a profound turning point that will fundamentally elevate our protection, prevention and rehabilitation programs. By infusing our daily work with trauma-informed strategies and advanced youth drug prevention tools, we are becoming better equipped to heal both the visible and invisible scars of exploitation. This international engagement reinforces our belief that protecting a child requires an endless amount of community and we return re-energized, inspired and more ready than ever to build a safer, brighter future for every child who walks through our doors.



Training on News Writing

LEEDO's Ongoing Projects

Transitional Shelters – Setu Bandhan

LEEDO's transitional shelter, Shetu Bandhan, serves as a vital emergency and temporary sanctuary for rescued children. Implementing LEEDO's comprehensive 360-degree 4R Strategy, the shelter provides a holistic environment for recovery and transition. This month alone, Shetu Bandhan opened its doors to 58 children, offering them the immediate protection and care needed to begin their journey toward a permanent solution.



Schools Under the Sky (SUS)



Through its seven open-air schools, LEEDO provides a vital educational lifeline to 2009 street-connected and slum children across Dhaka. Operating in key hubs, including Kamalapur, Airport, Tejgaon, Rayerbazar, Shaym Bazar, Sadarghat, and Mirpur LEEDO conducted 90 specialized sessions this month. These programs go beyond basic literacy and numeracy, offering essential life skills and psychosocial support to help children build a resilient future.

LEEDO Peace Home

LEEDO Peace Home is a safe, compassionate sanctuary for vulnerable children where care, respect and protection guide every moment. It hosts 68 children, including 27 special children, who receive education, food, shelter, health care, entertainment & sports activities and psychosocial support. The home builds resilience, hope and confidence through a family-like environment that encourages growth, learning and emotional healing. Visitors and partners strengthen solidarity and inclusion, ensuring every child is valued and supported for a brighter future through collective responsibility and community care that inspires long-term well-being and a lasting positive impact on every child's life.

Inclusive School

At our Inclusive School, every child's potential comes first. Here, "disability" never stands in the way of a bright future. Through a mix of art, handicrafts and space therapy, our students discover what they are truly capable of. Beyond lessons in the classroom, our psychosocial support and morning assemblies help them grow in spirit.



Journalism and Media Empowerment



LEEDO conducted 8 (Eight) journalism training and class sessions at the Peace Home under the Young Journalist Changemaker project. These sessions furnished children with skills in writing, reporting, photography and storytelling, empowering them to raise their voices and advocate for child rights.
